Marking the 80th anniversary of the end of World War II, this gripping two-part documentary uses newly colourised archive footage, expert interviews and high-end dramatic reconstructions to count down the 24 hours prior to the unconditional surrenders of Germany and Japan. Covering the death of Hitler, the fall of Berlin and the attempted coup that nearly thwarted Japan's surrender, delve into the moments that defined the rest of the 20th century.



Digging for Britain, Series 12






