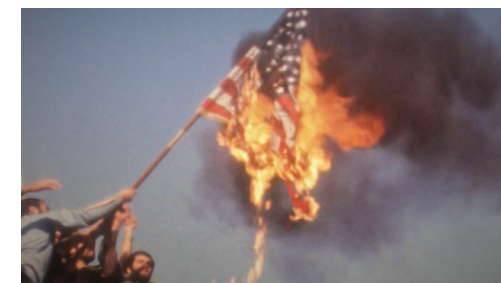

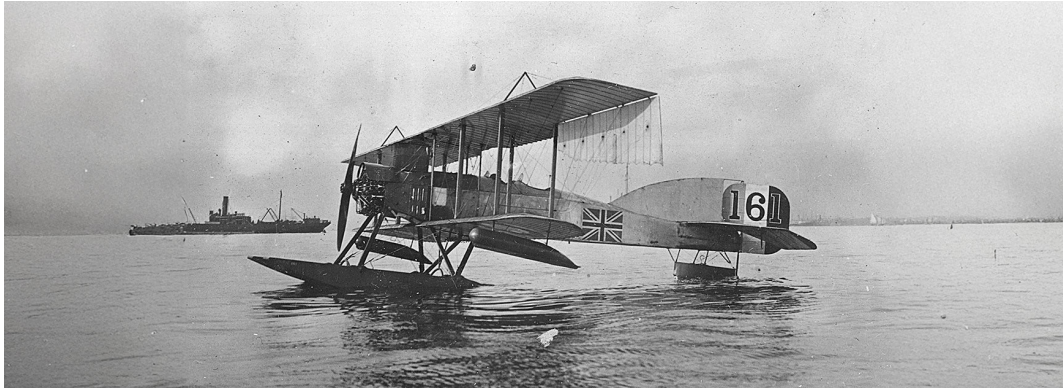


Free at Last: The Secrets of Apartheid

Beijing's Secret Blueprint

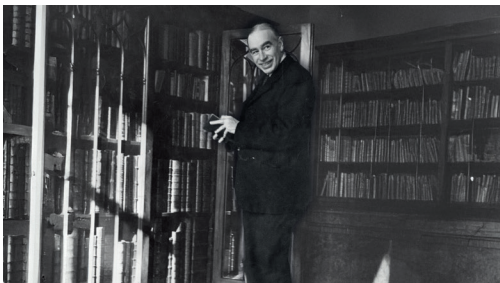

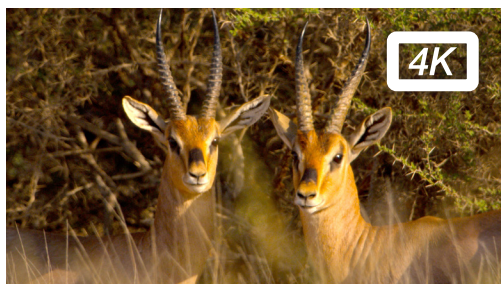
China's Wild Secrets
