Escape From Chernobyl: 48 Hours That Changed the World

On April 26th, 1986, the world witnessed the most devastating nuclear disaster in history: the explosion

of Reactor 4 at the Chernobyl Nuclear Power Plant. Forty years on, we revisit the critical 48 hours, from the failed safety test and subsequent Soviet cover-up, to the heroic divers sent on a suicide mission and the mass evacuation of 50,000 residents from Pripyat, who would never return home.



Atomic Reaction: Canada's Secret Role in the Manhattan Project

In 1943, Churchill and Roosevelt met in Quebec to sign a deal that fast-tracked the creation of the world's first nuclear weapon. The fallout is still felt in Canada today. Nazi Space Race

The Last Burma Star

The Day the War Ended

The Japanese surrender on August 15, 1945 ended World War II. But the people of Taiwan, who were under Japanese rule for the previous 50 years, suddenly became "Chinese", changing from losers to victors overnight. With their wartime experiences later buried in Taiwan's political turmoil, coloured archive and eyewitness accounts uncover this fascinating, lost chapter of history for the first time.



24 Hours That Changed the World
