Galapagos: Edge of the World

Format: 3 x 47 (4K) Broadcaster: EBS

The isolated Galapagos islands are home to a staggeringly diverse array of creatures found nowhere else in the world. The unique ecosystems and

magnificent flora and fauna of these islands famously inspired Darwin's Theory of Evolution. This series takes viewers on a stunning 4K journey around the islands, getting up close and personal with unique creatures and exploring the shifting relationship between man and nature in this near-Eden.



Lions: Now or Never

Format: 2 x 45 (4K) Broadcaster: Zee

African lions are highly endangered with some experts predicting their extinction by 2050. This blue-chip series explores how we can save this majestic species and the developing human-lion relationship. It investigates trophy hunting, the truth about the killing of Cecil the lion and reveals the methods behind the successful conservation of Asiatic lions in India.



Eco-Heroines, Series 3

Format: 3 x 52 (all series: 11 x 52) (4K) Broadcaster: Ushuaia TV

Discover the incredible work of leading conservationists on their mission to save a local species from the brink of extinction. Travelling across Argentina, New Zealand, Madagascar and more, we meet the women making a difference. Get up close with pangolins, lemurs, sloths, sharks and manta rays in this groundbreaking show, now in its third series.



Bear: Koala Hero

Format: 1 x 48 (4K) Broadcaster: Foxtel

Australian bushfires can burn through an area the size of England and Wales within days, destroying homes, habitats and hope. This one-off follows the incredible story of koala detection-dog 'Bear' and his team, as they rescue and rehabilitate injured koalas from burnt-out bushland. In the face of devastation, hope is rising from the ashes.



Secrets of the Aquarium

Step inside the UK's largest aquarium, home to over 4,000 marine animals from angelfish to tiger sharks. This state-of-the-art facility is run by a team of over 100 keepers where every day presents a new challenge. Featuring big characters and quirky creatures, this underwater adventure celebrates the drama and unpredictability of life in the aquarium.



Ancient Settlements of Europe

This award-winning mini-series uncovers the lost peoples that settled Northern Europe in the pre-Christian era. With access to archaeological digs and CGI reconstructions, episode one uncovers a lost Roman city deep in a Gallic forest, while episode two reveals how the Celts settled on the coast of Northern France.

Neanderthal: In the Footsteps of Another Humanity

On a Normandy beach, archaeologists are racing against time to preserve the world's largest collection of prehistoric footprints. With each discovery, their investigation unearths new details about the lives of the long extinct and widely mischaracterised Neanderthal, all brought to life through stunning animation and CGI.

Meet some of the most successful athletes of all time and the driving forces who inspired them. These women are part of a generation that shares a common goal, to achieve gender equality in sports. With no topic off limits, discussions unveil the personal, physical and mental barriers each woman has overcome to reach the top. Featuring exclusive interviews with Olympic athletes Dame Kelly Holmes, Dina Asher-Smith, international footballer Eniola Aluko and more.

Women's sport has come a long way in Asia, but female athletes still face many obstacles. Growing Wild

How can urban gardening help us reconnect with nature and improve our physical and mental health? Urban farmer Chris Leow is on a mission to cultivate healthy growing habits, trying his hand at everything from growing edibles in Singapore and building his own beehive in Australia, to learning indigenous farming methods in Thailand.



The Pill Revolution

Why is there such limited research into the contraceptive pill? Why are women offered so little choice? In this groundbreaking documentary, Davina

McCall tackles the troubling truth behind the pill, busting myths and taboos and investigating whether side effects are fact or fake news. We also explore alternative contraception including hormonal coils, implants and patches and ask what more can be done to improve women's healthcare.



China: Preparing for Dangerous Storms

The series features veterinarians, volunteers and park rangers who rescue exotic animals in need of help. Each episode covers four warm, humorous and family-friendly stories of care and rescue.



The Good Virus

Format: 1 x 60 / 1 x 90 Producer: TELUS

A global health emergency is here. Antibiotics are losing effectiveness and by 2050 it is estimated that

10 million people a year will die from superbugs. The situation is so dire that the US, Canada and Europe are allowing phage therapy – a century-old treatment piloted by the USSR – to be revitalised. Now, biotech companies are running clinical trials and these "good viruses" are transforming health's global frontiers.
