24 Hours That Changed the World

Marking the 80th anniversary of the end of World War II, this gripping series uses newly colourised archive footage, expert interviews and high-end dramatic reconstructions to count down the 24 hours which defined the 20th century, prior to the unconditional surrenders of Germany and Japan.



How the Second World War Became a Global War

Discover how the war between Britain and Germany escalated into a global conflict across five history-altering days in May 1940. Learn how the great superpowers such as France, the Soviet Union and China came to be involved in the world's deadliest war and how this conflict helped bring about the end of the British Empire.



The Day the War Ended

The Japanese surrender on August 15, 1945 ended World War II. But the people of Taiwan, under Japanese rule for the previous 50 years, suddenly became 'Chinese', changing from losers to victors overnight. With their wartime experiences later buried in Taiwan's political turmoil, colourised archive and eyewitness accounts uncover this fascinating, lost chapter of history for the first time.



Who Paid for World War II?

Lasting for six years, the Second World War was the most expensive war in history. In today's terms, the war cost over \$4 trillion - but who paid for it? This documentary reveals what happened after Britain ran out of cash to pay for arms, a shortage which had global consequences, leading to American dollars turning the tide of this most bankrupting of conflicts.

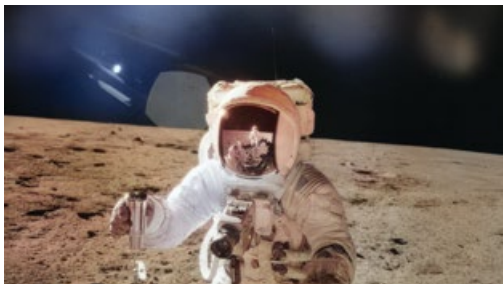


Revenge: Our Dad the Nazi Killer

As they delve into the past, they unearth a complex web of Nazi networks, covert Jewish vigilante groups and mysterious deaths and disappearances in post-World War II Australia. This gripping story asks: when, if ever, is taking the law into your own hands justified?



Nazi Space Race

The first Moon landing was instantly regarded as humanity's greatest achievement. However, the secrets behind this feat remain hidden from history. Leading Nazis were spared trial by the US and given senior roles in NASA's space mission in their bid to outmuscle the Soviets. The dark truths behind this story have never been told. Until now.



Norway's Nazis: Lottery of Death

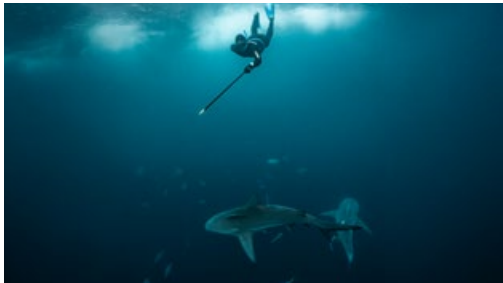
All Too Clear: Beneath the Surface of the Great Lakes
